Licence Controller Qualification

All General Manager's Certificate applicants must hold the Licence Controller Qualification (LCQ) which comprises the NZQA Unit Standards:

- 4646 Demonstrate knowledge of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 and its implications for licensed premises
- 16705 Demonstrate knowledge of Host Responsibility requirements as a duty manager on licensed premises.

Who benefits from this training?

Everyone in our community benefits when front-line hospitality and retail staff understand their legal obligations and are committed to providing safe drinking environments where customers can relax and enjoy themselves. The course is designed for:

- Duty and Club Managers
- Check-out operators and supervisors in supermarkets and liquor stores

If you are not fully enrolled by 12 noon on the Wednesday of the week before the course starts, you may forfeit your place.
